Preface

I would hope that some of you may have taken the opportunity to hear some of the presenters and discussions online. If you weren't able to I thought I'd write down some of the basics that I took from the trip and, as I get older, doing that quickly is always a good idea.

Thursday, October. 24, 2024

The day followed the ExCom meetings of Wednesday for the early arrivers.

The morning started with the DC/SC meeting discussing the current status of squadrons, reorganization and finances.

I was immediately struck by speakers that came up to speak and introduced themselves as Commander of one, two or four squadrons as well as SFO for multiple squadrons. This is the necessity that inspires our ExCom to find a new structure.

It appears that in areas with many historic squadrons in close proximity the remaining members are hesitant to 'surrender their warrants'. That was a reoccurring theme over the next few days.

At the squadron level finances are not a problem. For National it's always an issue although because of selling the building and utilizing the resources of the foundation it was less than an issue at this meeting. With the rebranding it seems the organization is willing to spend what's necessary to see how we can re-establish ourselves in the next couple of years.

Theres much encouragement in establishing that brand and we'll be refreshing handouts and getting identifying things such as CANBOAT badges and ordering shirts starting with the executive.

This group of DC/SC continued through an IT update.

I am happy to say that the topic of IT did not bring this meeting to it's knees for a change.

Yes, the IT system needs much improvement and Janet, National IT Officer, listed the path these upgrades will take.

Janet was also expressing the correct procedures for establishing system access. I took note and will be submitting the right forms to the right people to ensure the executive gets the access it needs.

Some of the IT update concerned the education group and course delivery.

To give you a hint of the new direction in delivering courses here's the most important example.

When a squadron offers any form of course whether self-study, hybrid (classroom and online) or classroom/in-person all students who register for that course will also be registered and given access to the online course materials. This dual-registration is just about to be implemented for PCOC and ROC(M) and will be shortly followed by B2 and B3.

Even courses that include a printed manual will see a student given access to the materials online to supplement their accessibility.

I like this idea and it's another path to encouraging in-person teaching in a variety of ways.

Membership

As for Membership there were many questions and answers concerning better detailing and presentation for the benefits offered to members. That was mostly about keeping it updated and communicated to the members.

Most of the Membership session(s) were devoted to encouraging squadrons to be more visible in their area and to try and devise ways to encourage more youth interaction. This might be, as I'm hoping for our squadron, to follow up on possibly teaching ROC(M) to the youth sailing group at RNYC.

This kind of approach could be taken as a yearly challenge to find another youth group such as Cadets? There are possibilities.

As we all sat around at the conference it was abundantly clear that we need to find some longterm plan to give a youthful injection even if it starts with collaboration with other groups.

At the main AGM on Saturday the group of DC/SC would vote to remove the condition that there was an age limit of 19 years old. Not sure who thought that one up but it's generally assumed that this organization can't afford to have such a condition at this point.

There was also a common thought that distributing helpful information and membership info to those who sell boats as well as clubs and marinas in the area might help to reach new boaters. Not a bad idea and worth a start even at the scale of our area.

Squadron Networking

The remainder of Thursday was as much about mingling and socializing with other squadrons across the country.

As is natural the districts tended to gravitate together and we were no different. The Atlantic group was prominent and well represented by Nigel's presence on the board as well.

The names are the usual suspects for Atlantic: Sarah-Jane Raine, Mary Ridgewell, Phil Evans, Nigel Stafford and more. A good crowd each offering any assistance and expertise they might be able to offer. Much time was sharing the problems we all saw in our areas and things we would try to help improve things.

Friday, October. 25, 2024

Friday began with all things Education.

Eric Phinney and Tom Beaver gave a good overview of the state of course content.

PCOC is picking up a slightly better Market share and it's an improved course over our previous offering.

ROC is the central money-maker beyond compare. There was an excellent show-and-tell on how to perform an online Part II examination which is the greatest challenge of ROC. There are still efforts to pool testing resources so even squadrons that don't have access to someone to do examinations the load can be spread across those available in other regions. This is working.

This year we seem to have finally reached the point where promising to have both English and French versions released at the same time seems possible. There were many requests for translation assistance for all new materials currently in production.

Surprisingly there was great uptake on this and we seem to have found a good crowd to share the load and speed things up. They were enthusiastic and the course chairs were lining them up immediately.

That was a far better result than previous years.

The remainder of Friday

Later in the day there were some guest speakers with a continuation of the previous DC/SC session. This entailed an extension of the marketing/branding issues from a previous session.

It was also my first opportunity to get to know Kelly Symons the new National office manager and what directions she is taking things. She seems very results based and is aiming for a new stability on the administrative side of things.

As an aside, I also got to know our key finance/admin person that is our point of contact from our Squadron FO perspective. He seems well grounded and has been happy to respond when a squadron has a problem accessing and understanding the balancing of books.

In the evening some fun entertainment with food, drink and the James Bond Theme.

Saturday, October 26, 2024

The National AGM

The main event saw much formality along with quite a lot of useful information on the state of the organization.


Included for the membership were overviews of each of the departments as well as future paths the organization is taking in terms of management, organization, courses and outreach.
